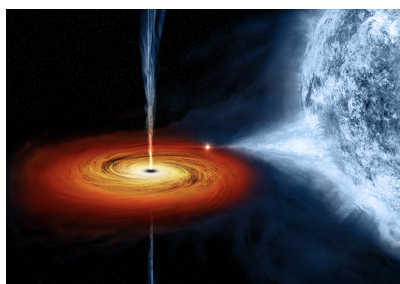

Thursday, April 29: Black Holes And Galaxies

Join Betsy Hernandez, a researcher at Princeton University, and discover how Einstein's theory of general relativity and black holes were described mathematically before any observational evidence existed.
